In 2024, Trust Drum Circles was thrilled to secure a partnership with the **Boys and Girls Club of Northeast Ohio** to launch an engaging music education program for local youth. Running through May 2025, this series of recurring drumming sessions will introduce participants to African drumming traditions, allowing them to explore cultural heritage, develop musical skills, and express themselves creatively.

The program is designed to foster both individual growth and group collaboration, helping participants build teamwork, confidence, and emotional well-being. Through rhythm-based education, we aim to show how music can be a transformative tool for self-expression and connection to global cultures.

This partnership exemplifies our commitment to making arts education accessible, especially for underserved communities. We are excited about the opportunity to expand this initiative, and hope that it serves as an inspiration for other organizations to consider similar partnerships with us to bring the power of rhythm and culture to more youth in the coming years.



## Program Spotlight



In 2024, Trust Drum Circles formed a meaningful partnership with the **HELP Foundation Inc.** to bring fun music therapy programs to individuals with special needs. Through this collaboration, we offered a therapeutic drumming session designed to enhance emotional expression, improve motor skills, and promote social connection.

Our initiatives provided a safe and supportive space where participants can explore rhythm and sound, helping them build self-confidence, reduce stress, and improve overall well-being. This partnership strengthened our commitment to accessible, inclusive programming that supports diverse communities. We are excited to continue this work in the upcoming year, creating more opportunities for healing and connection through the universal language of rhythm.

Trust Drum Circles is excited to partner with **ECOWICE** to expand programming in Tanzania. ECOWICE is dedicated to fostering common ground by integrating ecotourism, cultural heritage, and wildlife conservation, thereby creating opportunities for sustainable development.

We have transitioned from individually executing our activities to partnering with local African nonprofit organizations for community-based program delivery. Through these alliances, we directly empower artisans and performers to strengthen their communities through art and music, while also providing a platform to showcase their talents to local and international interest. Below, under the Trust Drum Circles program network, we feature Kikosi Kazi, or 'Taskforce' performing by the Mikumi National Park.



We also a partnered with **Refugee Relief Initiative** to amplify our 1000 drum project in two orphanages and organize events in Yaoundé for internally displaced families affected by the current Cameroon civil war.

We engaged adults with disabilities and at-risk youth to nurture their rhythm. Rooted in joy, our circles foster connection, and personal growth, helping participants experience a sense of belonging and optimism through rhythm.



#### **Cultural Preservation**

We engaged with local villages and drum makers to promote cultural preservation and support sustainable craftsmanship. Through these partnerships, we've not only expanded our outreach but also helped sustain local economies by promoting the skill development of drummaking as we reach our 1000 Drum Project goal.


